Dr. Susan Hollowell is the Director of the Transportation Security Laboratory (TSL), a Federal Laboratory of the Science and Technology Directorate (S&T) of the Department of Homeland Security (DHS). This laboratory is responsible for researching, developing, and evaluating solutions to detect, deter and mitigate improvised explosive devices used against transportation systems. Prior to this, she was manager of the Explosives and Weapons Detection R&D Branch of the Transportation Security Laboratory. Dr. Hollowell was granted a Doctor of Philosophy in Analytical Chemistry from the University of Delaware in 1989 for work in the area of biosensor development. She holds a Bachelor of Arts from Western Maryland College with a major in chemistry. She is a member of the American Chemical Society, the American Association for the Advancement of Science, the New York Academy of Science, National Association of Female Executives, and is an elected member of Sigma Xi, the society of research scientists.
