Mark is a Commercialization Manager at the Oak Ridge National Laboratory (UT-Battelle, LLC, management and operating contractor). Prior to joining the Laboratory's Technology Transfer and Economic Development directorate in 2000, he was Technical Assistant to the Vice President of Lockheed Martin Energy Research Corporation, the prior M&O contractor for the Laboratory. Mark joined the Laboratory as a postdoctoral research associate in 1983, and became a research staff member in 1986. He operated research programs in bioremediation of hazardous environmental chemicals and biomimetics/biomaterials, and from 1995 through 1998 was the Director of the Laboratory's Bioprocessing Research and Development Center. Mark has negotiated more than a dozen royalty-bearing licenses and CRADAs.

Mark earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Biology/Chemistry at the University of North Alabama in 1977, a Doctor of Philosophy in Microbial Physiology and Biochemistry from the University of Tennessee in 1982, and a Master of Business Administration degree from Colorado State University in 2001. He has served as ORNL's Alternate FLC Representative since 2002 and delivered a presentation on Pre-Election Assessments of New Technologies at the FLC Southeast Region Annual meeting in Clearwater Beach last October. Mark will be the recipient of two Excellence in Technology Transfer awards at the upcoming National FLC meeting in Orlando in May.

Mark holds adjunct professorships at Louisiana State University and at Mississippi State Technical Community College in Knoxville, TN where he presently teaches classes in Introductory Biology and Human Anatomy and Physiology in the evenings.
