Paul Zielinski is currently serving as Chief of the Office of Technology Partnerships at the National Institute of Standards and Technology (NIST). Previously, Paul served as the Chief, Cross Program Staff at the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). In this role, he was responsible for technology transfer and science outreach spanning across EPA's traditional media programs (e.g., air, water, land), including EPA technology transfer. His other positions at EPA included the Chief, Planning Staff in the Office of Research and Development, where he was responsible for designing and directing a multi-year planning approach for EPA's science and research programs, and acting Chief for Waste and Special Programs research.

Paul has also worked at the U.S. Department of Energy as the lead for budget and strategic planning for DOE's Global Nuclear Energy Program, and as a program manager responsible for cleanup operations at some of our nation's most contaminated waste sites. Prior to working at DOE, he served on active duty as an officer in the U.S. Army.
